



The Show Goes On!

orlds week was well under way and the ISIA Education Foundation Benefit on Ice show committee was already scouting for performers when it was announced that headliner Ashley Wagner had to cancel due to a family emergency. While Ashley and her fans were disappointed with the news, the show went on as scheduled on Aug. 1 at the New England Sports Center, starring 2010 Olympian and 2013 U.S. National bronze medalist Mirai Nagasu. The first skater to star in the show three times, Mirai was enthusiastically welcomed back, and pulled out all the stops for her two crowd-pleasing performances.

As a bonus for the audience and through the generosity of the local skating community, this year's show also featured 2013 U.S. National silver medalist Ross Miner and the most successful U.S. synchronized skating team in the history of the sport, the Haydenettes, winners of 22 U.S. National gold medals and four World bronze medals.

Jason Pische served as our master of ceremonies, demonstrating that successful ice arena managers are multi-talented. When Jason is not working for FMC as the manager of the Chelmsford Ice Forum in

Chelmsford, Mass., he can be found doing standup comedy and using his professional announcing skills in other venues.

I was fortunate to have the legendary Mr. Dick Button assisting me in presenting the 2014 scholarships during the show intermission to two of this year's five recipients, Elodie Sandraz of Palo Alto, Calif. and Carly Potts of Jefferson City, Mo., both of whom performed in the show. While the other three

The Benefit on Ice scouting team observed competitors at all levels throughout Worlds week, selecting participants to join in the Friday night ice skating extravaganza. Through their recommendations, we were able to showcase a variety of talent from across the ISI program spectrum (see list, next page). The first half featured some of our oldest and youngest competitors. Bob and Lorna Hodgson from the Skating Club of Youngstown performed their Family Spotlight and, at ages 89 and 85, respectively, they showed us that skating truly is a lifetime sport.

Two lucky winners secured spots in the show through the Skate with the Stars fundraising raffle. Tickets were

sold in the rink Monday through Wednesday and on the Competitors' Cruise Wednesday night just before the drawing. The raffle winners

WINTER CLASSIC IN THE HEARTLAND: WHAT'S NOT TO LOVE?

hat better place to enjoy your most beloved winter skating competition over Valentine's Day weekend than in the Heartland? With the soaring Gateway Arch as your landmark, follow the Mighty Mississippi to St. Louis, then travel a short distance west

to St. Peters Rec-Plex. This is where, come Feb. 13-15, you'll find Winter Classic — one of ISI's largest national competitions, featuring individual and group events for all ages.

Perhaps you've had the pleasure of experiencing the Midwestern hospitality during the many events that have been hosted at the Rec-Plex. Located just 30 minutes west of St. Louis, this fantastic facility previously has hosted the 1998 ISI Worlds, the 2008 and 2012 ISI Synchronized Championships and several Winter Classic competitions. The complex encompasses two impressively equipped buildings in a park setting, with three NHL-size ice rinks and seating for 300 to 1,200 spectators.


Also known as the Heartland, St. Louis' central location makes it a natural destination for a national event. A visit to the Gateway Arch Riverfront is a must if you want to see the nation's tallest manmade monument, the 630-foot Gateway Arch, which is precisely as wide as it is tall. You can ride an enclosed tram to the top, view informational exhibits and films, experience a giant-screen movie, visit the Museum of Westward Expansion and even go shopping.

The Arch is just one of the marvels to be discovered in St. Louis. Did you know that the city's 1,300-acre Forest Park is one of the largest urban parks in the world, bigger than even New York City's Central Park? Known as "the soul of the city," Forest Park is home to many of St. Louis' most popular attractions, including the city zoo, a science center and planetarium, history and art museums, even an outdoor ice rink for winter skating.

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ISI Synchronized Championships at Miami University — What Could Be Smarter?

The ISI Synchronized Championships competition returns to Goggin Ice Center at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio for 2015. The event is set for April 10-12, just in time to experience springtime on one of the most appealing college campuses in the nation, which the poet Robert Frost once described as "the most beautiful campus that ever was." Others have called it "a hidden gem."

In addition to the beauty of the campus, you'll be thrilled at the opportunity to skate in the state-of-the-art Goggin Ice Center, home of Miami University's acclaimed Redhawks varsity synchronized skating teams, which compete at the national, international and world championship levels. The Miami collegiate team made history this year by winning their 10th consecutive national title (for a total of 16!); the senior team has won three national championships and holds the highest placement by any U.S. team at the World Synchronized Skating Championships, where they finished in second place in 2007.

Synchro Champs includes eight age groups: Tot, Junior Youth, Youth, Senior Youth, Teen, Collegiate, Adult and Master. The competition features seven event categories: Synchronized Skating Team, Synchronized Skating Compulsories, Synchronized Formation Team, Synchronized Formation Compulsories, Synchronized

Advanced Formation Team, Synchronized Open Skating Team and Synchronized Dance Team.

In addition to the three days of competition events, Synchro Champs weekend includes the annual Synchro Showcase exhibition featuring performances selected throughout the competition as well as special guest skaters.


If your team finds some time for off-ice activities, you can check out the quaint college town atmosphere of Uptown Park or High Street, both packed with local history and fun places to eat and shop. Other nearby attractions include Cincinnati Premium Outlet and THE WEB Extreme Entertainment, a one-stop entertainment destination featuring a multi-level laser tag arena, an electric indoor go-kart track, a blacklight mini-golf course, a bowling alley and an arcade.

Set in one of Ohio's most scenic areas, Oxford is within convenient travel distance of Chicago, Cleveland, Columbus, Detroit, Pittsburgh, Knoxville and many other areas home to ISI members. Cincinnati and Dayton are less than an hour away.

Join us in Oxford next spring! Entry deadline is Feb. 15.



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Rocked Our Worlds!

he 2014 ISI World Recreational Team Championships was a huge hit with the 103 rink teams that brought more than 1,400 participants to New England Sports Center July 28-Aug. 2. Sharper Edge Skating School of West Concord, Mass. took home the Michael Booker Trophy after sweeping the competition with 1712 points.

The annual event featured ISI skaters representing all skill levels and ages, from the four adorable preschoolers to the four "senior" skaters ages 75-89 years young.

Rink teams from 24 states and three foreign countries — China, Philippines and Qatar — participated in the Boston event. The team from the Philippines traveled the greatest distance, an impressive 8,486 miles.

Two local skating facilities, FMC William Chase Arena from Natick, Mass., and Nashoba Valley Olympia from Boxborough, Mass., brought the largest teams, with 113 and 110 members, respectively.

In addition to the competition itself, Worlds was filled with fun attractions and activities all week long.

Flipping for Flip!

One of the BIGGEST — literally! — highlights of Worlds this year was Flip, in all of his various incarnations. He was everywhere! That's right, the lovable ISI mascot made three live appearances throughout the week, providing hugs and photo opportunities for fans of all ages.

Skaters and visitors scoured the arena Monday through Friday looking for answers to the "Find Flip at Worlds" contest. 

Nutrition 101 for Young Skaters

What is nutrition?

Nutrition is getting the fuel (like gas in a car) to make your muscles move. We get our fuel from the foods we eat. The three main fuels are carbohydrates, fats and protein. When you eat a meal, your digestive system (your tummy) breaks down the food you have eaten into these main fuels.

From the digestive system, the fuels travel through your blood to the muscles you will use to skate. Your muscles take the fuel from the blood and bring them into a special part of the muscle cell called the mitochondria. Inside the mitochondria the fuels are broken down even more by cool chemical reactions to create ENERGY! (See Figure 1.)

When to eat? What to eat?

You want to make sure you provide your muscles with fuel (to make ENERGY) before you skate because when we skate the stomach does not work as fast. Eat meals three to four hours before skating.


During practice it is wise to keep providing some fuel, but at a smaller serving size than a meal. Foods or drinks with

carbohydrates work best. Many foods and drinks designed for sports are good choices during exercise as they have carbohydrates that are easy for the stomach to break down.

Avoid proteins immediately before and during exercise. Drink water every 15 minutes during exercise, as this will

keep the blood flowing better and getting those fuels to your muscles faster.

Once you have stopped skating, you need to get even more fuel to those muscles. This is important because during exercise muscles get some wear





and tear, and they need extra fuel to get back to feeling well enough to skate again. After your skate time, as soon as you feel up to it, have a snack with carbohydrates and proteins. Some suggestions are chocolate milk, a sports bar with protein, peanut butter crackers, a banana or a handful of nuts.

Take-home points

Feed your body foods that you know do not upset your stomach. You will feel best if you eat foods on a regular schedule so your stomach learns how to anticipate and react.

Each year, the ISIA Education Foundation awards scholarships to ISI skaters who have demonstrated a commitment to academics and service. The application process is open to students in their senior year of high school through their junior year in an undergraduate program. However, most recipients begin their qualification process during their middle-school years. Start your four-step process of qualification today!



- 1 Maintain at least a 3.0 GPA.
- **2** Participate in a variety of school and community activities. Keep detailed records, including frequency of participation.
- 3 Continue to test and compete in the ISI program, especially during the two years prior to application. Keep good records of all skating activity.
- 4 Prior to application, complete 120 hours of verified service, of which at least 60 must be in association with an ISI member facility. This information must be recorded on the Service Hours Verification Form, which is part of the scholarship application available at skateisi.org/foundation.

About the Coach

Revolution Coach Jenn Caron was diagnosed with a large brain tumor just two weeks after ISI Synchronized Championships in April. With only a 50 percent chance of surviving the seven-hour surgery to remove the tumor, she not only survived but was back at home with her husband and baby 48 hours later. An MRI confirmed the tumor had been completely removed. Within three days, Coach Jenn was back at the rink watching her Revolution skaters perform in their Spring Ice Show. Ironically, her adult team, which she both coaches and skates with, had chosen the slogan "Thanks for making me a fighter!" well before Jenn's diagnosis.

A Toronto native, Coach Jenn was a competitive solo skater before joining Black Ice, a national and international championship synchro team. She moved to the U.S. in 2000 to coach a Junior international team, winning a silver medal in the Czech Republic and a pewter at U.S. Nationals.

With the dream of having her own team, she started Revolution the very next season. Jenn has also served as the head synchronized skating coach at Northwestern University and Illinois State University.
