

## **Level 10 Video Testing Guidelines (2022)**

The following are guidelines for your Level 10 Test submission:

- Skaters wishing to take a level 10 video test must submit a Level 10 application by the first of the month in which they plan to test. Level 10 tests will be accepted during 2022 in the months of January, March, June, July, September and November. This application should be sent to Kim Hansen, Skating Programs and National Events Director at KHansen@skateisi.org.
- A YouTube link to the video is the preferred method for submission. This link should be marked private and only viewable by the select individuals that have been given the link.
- Skaters should take care to present themselves appropriately wearing a nice costume or skating attire with neat hair appearance.
- Skaters should introduce themselves on camera with their name, home rink, and the test that they are submitting as well as the day and time that the test is being skated.
- There must be a current professional member (coach) of ISI in attendance to serve as proctor for the test.
- The video must be unedited and use a single camera.

## Freestyle 10, Pairs 10, Couples 10

The video must show every required compulsory maneuver attempted two times each (performed in the same order as listed in the current ISI Handbook) and then followed by the non-stop program. It is permissible for the skater to take a small break in between but the filming must not stop.

## Ice Dancing 10

The video should be taken from the hockey box at ice level zoomed in to include turns/edges – but not too much so that the pattern is not visible

- The video link must be received by the ISI office no later than the 15th of the month in which the test was applied for.
- Before sending the video to ISI, watch and review the video to make sure all the requirements are met. Also check specific maneuvers so everything can be seen clearly.
- All level 10 tests will be judged by 5 examiners selected by the ISI office. The skater must pass by three of the five examiners.
- All incomplete tests will have a maximum of 30 days to re-test at no charge. After that 30-day period, the entire test must be re-submitted with a new application form and additional payment.

To maintain the integrity of our judging process, ISI video tests should not be posted on any social media site.
